About Tsinghua University



Located in the northwestern suburbs of Beijing, Tsinghua University was built in 1911 on the site of "Qing Hua Yuan" - the former royal garden of the Qing Dynasty. Run by part of the "Boxing Indemnity", it at first was merely a preparatory school called "Tsinghua Xue Tang" for the students who were sent by the Government to study in the United States of America. It changed to "Tsinghua School" after the "1911 Revolution". In 1925, the school became the National Tsinghua University. After the Resistance War Against Japanese broke out, Tsinghua University was moved south to Changsha, then Kunming and merged into the Southwest Associated University together with Peking University and Nankai University. In 1946, Tsinghua University returned to its original campus in Beijing.

Tsinghua University is a comprehensive and State key university having disciplines of science, engineering, management and social science with engineering as its main focus. As one of the important national bases for higher learning and for scientific research and technological development, Tsinghua University shoulders great responsibility of educating high-level talents for the Country and promoting the national economic construction.

At present, Tsinghua University consists of 6 schools, 31 departments, 44 research institutes, 9 engineering research centers and 163 laboratories including 15 national key laboratories. The university offers 37 Bachelor's degree programs as majors, 107 Master's degree programs and 64 Ph.D. degree programs for graduate students. What is TUICMP

Tsinghua University Internship China and Mandarin Program (TUICMP) is offering Mandarin courses and internship programs to international students. The Mandarin classes are designed to help students improve quickly and in particular to speak Chinese more fluently. It incorporates all aspects of the Chinese language including, speaking, reading, writing, listening, grammar, vocabulary, comprehension, and pronunciation.

Students study Mandarin for many different reasons: for travel, for business, for work or just for pleasure, therefore at TUICMP, special option classes which are conducted in the afternoon are designed to help students achieve their individual goals.

TUICMP Mandarin program offers the following support and services:

- Total immersion in the Mandarin
- Small classes

Study Programs



TUICMP offers a unique range of courses to meet the needs of a diverse group seeking to understand the Chinese language, culture and business. These include long term programs as well as intensive programs. The aim of these programs is to ensure language learning is linked to business and vocational outcomes wherever these can be applied.

The Chinese Language and Internship Program is designed for students who have interest in combining Chinese language studies with practical work experience in a Beijing company.

Students, through TUICMP, have options to study in the following programs:

- Intensive Mandarin
- Internship China (Mandarin plus Internship)
- Mandarin for Business
- The Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK) Preparation
- Study Tours (group)

1. Intensive Mandarin

Our Mandarin Course offers an intensive 20 hours per week of study, which includes both language development (listening, speaking, reading and writing) as well as Chinese cultural understanding. All the teachers are highly qualified and experienced and many have lived abroad. All students will be given a placement test to determine their Mandarin level proficiency and throughout the course the students are encouraged to fully participate in all activities.

The curriculum focuses on language instruction, emphasizing grammar, oral comprehension, and speaking. Classes take place on the campus of TUICMP by trained instructors.

This program is intended for short-term intensive study. With small class size and dynamic and interactive way of teaching, we ensure that you will progress and learn more in less time.

For beginners, the teaching focuses on conversation. We believe that this is important for our students who have limited study time in China and will enjoy the opportunity to speak and use the language. However, if a student's level is higher, they will spend more time on reading and writing.

The curriculum is augmented by a rich mixture of extracurricular activities and field trips and students can also participate in a post-program tour.

2. Mandarin for Business

The Mandarin for Business course is designed to focus on teaching you the language skills required in the professional working environments. There is a great deal of practical emphasis including exposure to business situations.

You will learn how to speak confidently in public situations, how to conduct yourself at meetings in Mandarin, how to communicate effectively by telephone, and email. Classes are small with a high degree of personal attention.

Participants attending this course are required to have a good knowledge of basic grammar in Chinese approximately 1000 word vocabulary in Chinese.

Level	: Intermediate to Advanced
Duration	: 20 weeks
Content	: 20 lessons per week
Commencement Date	: Student can choose to start course on first Monday of every month

3. Internship China (Mandarin plus Internship)

This program is designed for students who are looking for a different experience in China; students may wish to consider this Internship Program – a combination of Chinese language study and unpaid placement at a workplace.

The program will offer you opportunities to use Chinese at a workplace, develop skills in Chinese business practice; make excellent business contacts; establish friendships with local Chinese, and become immersed in Chinese business, society and culture.

Reasons why you should choose this program:

- Gives you international work experience
- Exposes you to the Chinese culture
- Improves your Chinese language
- Immerses you in everyday Chinese life
- Gives you opportunities to make new friends

Please note: At least 10 weeks of Intensive Mandarin program is required prior to commencement of the internship.

4. HSK Preparation

The Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK) is China's national standardized test of Mandarin. It is designed and developed by the HSK Center of Beijing Language and Culture University. The HSK's objective is to assess the Chinese language proficiency of non-native speakers.

This program is preparing students to take the elementary/intermediary level of HSK (The Chinese Proficiency Test) and is designed to assist them to achieve a high score on the HSK. The course content includes exam taking skills and strategies as well as general Chinese, including grammar, vocabulary, reading and listening comprehension.

The HSK Preparation Program is run for 4 weeks prior to the exam date. Once you have completed the HSK preparation course, you are able to sit for the HSK exam in Hangzhou - one of the Chinese cities where HSK is held.

The test is best taken when the student has acquired 400 ~ 3,000 basic Chinese words.

5. Study Tours (Group)

Mandarin learning plus sightseeing – TUICMP arranges study tours for large or small groups visiting China. Many groups find this an ideal way to see China. The Mandarin training programs are available and tailored to suit individual group needs. Classes and excursions may be integrated into our intensive Mandarin programs or delivered specifically to a group.

The lessons are interesting and fun, and they encourage you to speak in Mandarin. They are connected closely with the afternoon activities, so you can apply what you have learnt in class to real life situations.

Our Study Tours teachers are native Mandarin speakers, with University degrees and specialist qualifications. They are highly qualified and experienced professionals, who provide the highest standards of Mandarin training.

A typical study tour includes:

Accommodation options:

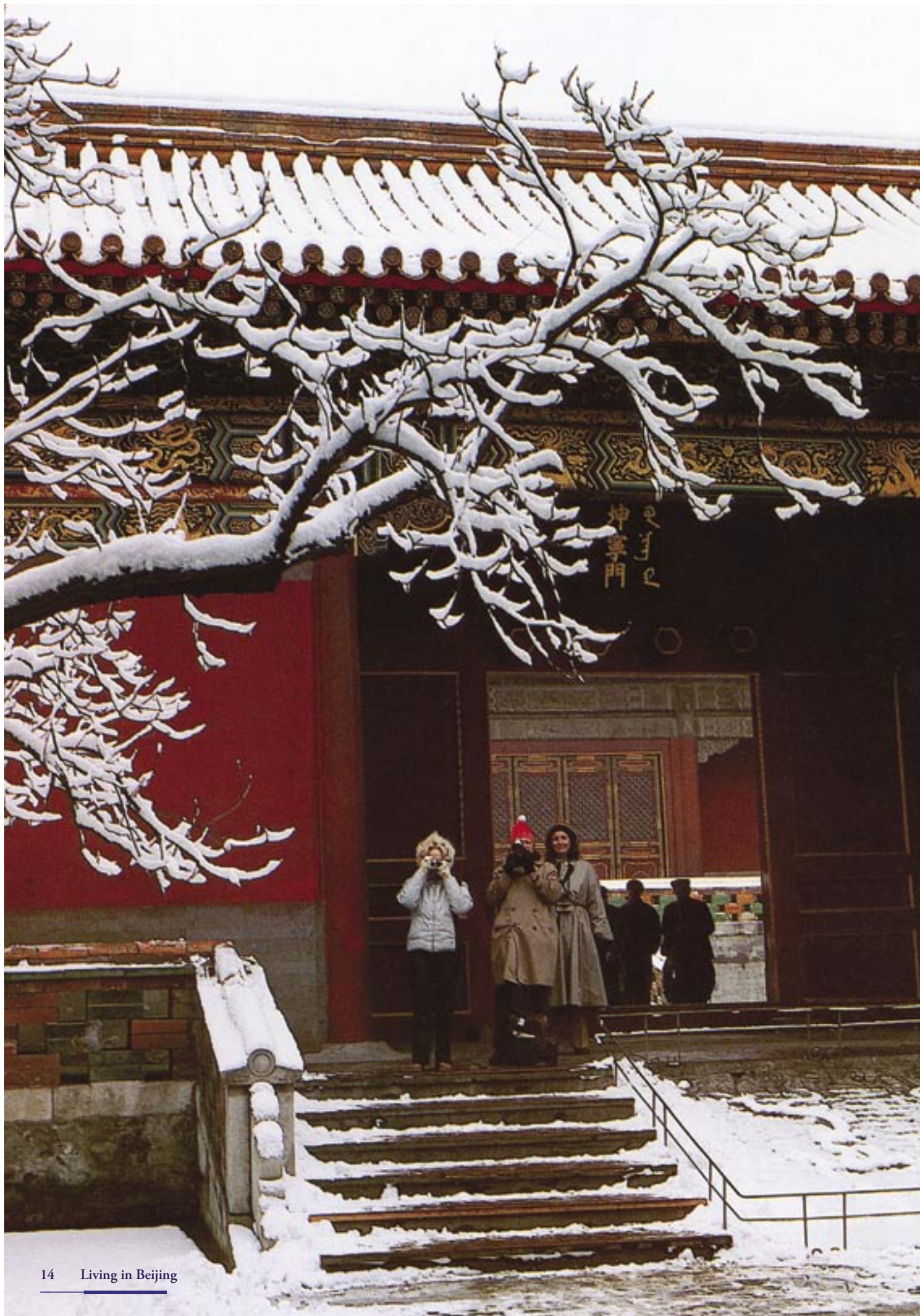
■ Student Lodge

Student lodges are located close to the city and students have their own bedroom with shared facilities such as bathrooms, kitchens and lounge rooms. Meals are included in some lodges.

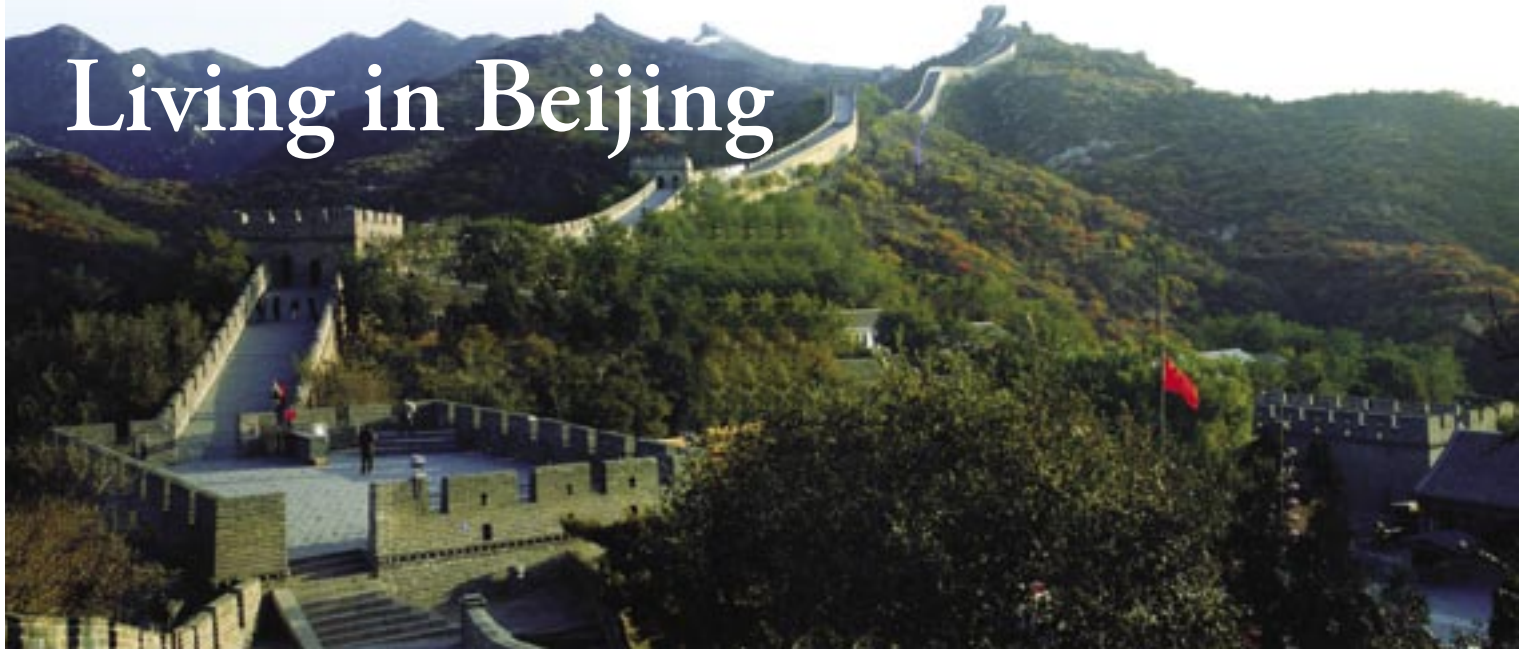
■ Shared apartments

Students will have their own rooms, however, students will have the experience of sharing their apartments with other International Students. The apartments are fully furnished. Meals are not included but each apartment has well a furnished kitchen where students can cook their own meals. Most apartments are located within walking distance of the training centre or are easily accessible by public transport.

TUICMP will also assist in organizing airport pick-up upon your first arrival in Beijing. One of TUICMP staff will meet you at Beijing airport and transfer you to your accommodation. The distance from the airport to the city centre is approximately 50 minutes by car.



Living in Beijing



Beijing- The capital of China is located in the northern part of the North China Plain and its terrain is high in the northwest and low in the southeast.

Beijing is an exciting place to live. The foods, culture, history and shopping are all a wonderful experience – it is a place where everything is different.

As the capital city of China, there is a concentration of business, government and culture in Beijing. In the centre of Beijing are the Forbidden City and Tiananmen Square - and a return trip to the Great Wall of China can be completed in half a day.

The climate in Beijing is of the continental type, with cold and dry winters, due to the Siberian air masses that move southward across the Mongolian Plateau. The summers are hot owing to warm and humid monsoon winds from the southeast bringing Beijing most of its annual precipitation. January is the coldest month and July is the warmest. Winter usually begins towards the end of October. The summer months, June to August, are wet and hot with about 40% of the annual precipitation.

It is relatively inexpensive to live in China, with everyday needs such as food and clothing being highly affordable. The people of Beijing are friendly, and the transport system, although crowded, is very efficient.

Beijing will host the Olympic Games in 2008 and already the city has the Olympic feel about it as it prepares for the international event.

Attractions in Beijing:

A wonderful place to visit, Summer Palace has many scenic areas that live up to it being China's largest imperial garden. In the spring, a beautiful field of flowers in a great place for picnics or go past the boat to a slightly wooded area for a beautiful view of the Palace and lake. It's an inexpensive place to visit that's well worth the money to get in. Nearby Fragrant Hills is also a nice place to visit with hiking/walking trails.

The Forbidden City, also known as Imperial Palace Museum, is of course a popular place to go. As its name implies, the Imperial Palace was a forbidden place for those not of the imperial family or court, which makes it even more intriguing to Westerners. South of the Forbidden City is Tiananmen Square, made more interesting due to the student protests that occurred in 1989. In the spring, it's also the place to go for seeing magnificent kites being flown.

There are many temples in Beijing to be seen, the most notable being the Temple of Heaven which is found in Tian Tan Park. Located in southern Beijing, the Temple of Heaven is a public park that is considered to be one of the the most beautiful temple complexes, with its two ceremonial buildings, which are circular in shape with blue-tiled roofs.

The renovated Badaling Great Wall is another popular place to visit, but a trip to the Simitai Great Wall is a great experience, particularly for those who like things "untouched." The Ming Tombs are where most emperors are buried from the Ming Dynasty.

2. Submit the form and the supporting documents by email/fax/mail to TUICMP or to one of our representatives

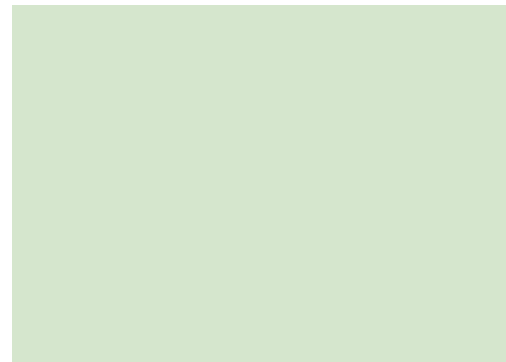
If the application is successful, TUICMP will issue a Letter of Offer for the course that you have applied for. The Letter of Offer contains information on commencement date, fees, visa information and other relevant information on your program.

Step 2:

1. Submit the Acceptance Form
2. Pay all the fees that are indicated in the Letter of Offer
3. Once the Acceptance Form and the payment of fees have been received by TUICMP, a confirmation of your enrolment will be given to you.
4. Arrive on time for your orientation

Application

A non refundable fee of US\$100 is required with each application.

The Application Form should be received at least 4 - 6 weeks prior to the beginning of the course. A confirmation of the application will be sent by return post, fax or email.

Payment terms

1. 20% of invoice to be paid on confirmation. Confirmation deposit is non-refundable.
2. Balance of remaining 80% must be made at least 3 weeks before the beginning of the course. If we receive a registration less than 4 weeks before the starting date, then full payment is required upon receipt of confirmation of application. Payments must be made in US Dollars by Telegraphic Transfer, International Cheque, traveller's cheque.
3. If full payment is not received 3 weeks prior to departure without prior arrangement, the deposit is forfeited and position is cancelled.
